Nichole Rowe says, "Racism is a systems problem, now it's a network of people who are trying to change the system".

- 1. Describe how you see racism as a systems problem.
- 2. What structures exist in the school (or school system) you work in that perpetuate racist systems?
- 3. What actions are necessary in order to change these systems?
- 4. What can you do to support these necessary actions?

Anthony Santiago said, "Often times it's easy for educators to ignore that there are race issues... our focus was equity and access to the curriculum and... some harsh things came up".

- 2. If a group of educators came to visit your school and looked at equity and access in the classroom, would you expect this group to find "some harsh things"? Why or why not?
